## The Reverend David H. Green

The Reverend David H. Green was born and raised in San Antonio, Texas. He is a 1987 graduate of Austin College (Sherman, Texas), with a B.A. in History and Political Science. While attending Austin College, Rev. Green began a career in Dallas where he became a paralegal. There he worked largely with consumer and business debtors in a thriving bankruptcy practice.

Sensing a call into ordained ministry, Rev. Green enrolled in the Union Theological Seminary in Virginia (Richmond, Virginia). While at Union Seminary, he was elected President of the Student Body, served as a Student Advisory Delegate to the 207<sup>th</sup> (1995) General Assembly, and received several Fellowships. Rev. Green holds a Master of Divinity degree (1997) and a Master of Theology in Biblical Studies (1999).

Rev. Green's pastoral experience includes service to three congregations. As a graduate student, he served in a non-ordained position at the Hebron Presbyterian Church (Manakin-Sabot, Virginia). In Virginia, he worked with the Reverend Dr. Ben Lacy Rose, a well-known pastor and retired seminary professor. Rev. Green was ordained by Grace Presbytery in 1998 when he began his service to the Centre Presbyterian Church (near Longview, Texas) as its pastor. In 2000, he moved to Charlotte, North Carolina where he continues to serve the First Presbyterian Church as its Associate Minister for Christian Education. Rev. Green is responsible for a large and dynamic educational ministry that includes Church school for all ages, a Wednesday evening family program, two preschools, and a growing number of small group Bible studies.



Rev. Green is married to the former Miss Leigh Lankford. She was born and raised in Dallas, Texas and is a graduate of Baylor University. They have three children – Josh (a 9-year old third grader), Daniel (a 6-year old kindergartner), and Matthew (a 4-year old preschooler).
